If God would mark our inigaties and judge us today, none of us would stand. How often do you really sit down and think about thin?

Let us begin by considering our text

Once again, we find these three verses in Hebrews talking about how the priesthood of Jesus is "A Better Priesthood." Appropriately, my message this morring is entitled, "A Better Priesthood (part 3)." Part 1 began in verse 11. Part 2 began in verse 18. And now, this morring Part 3 begins in verse 28.

Now, the reason why I have entitled my messages each week, "A Better Priesthood" is because this is the main point of the writer to the Hebrews. This section concluded with these words: "Now the main point in what has been said is this: we have such a high priest, who has taken His sect at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens" (Heb. 8:1). This is the main point of our section. We have such a high priest

And now, we come this moning to look at two more characteristics of the priesthood continually. And now, we come this moning to look at two more characteristics of the priesthood of Jesus. Both of them make Jesus better than any of the high presess of the OLG Testament. Let's look at my first point this moning. Jesus is ... 1. A pure Priest (were 26 Z7).

As you read verse 26 again, I want for you to listen to all of the words (and phrases) that describe Jesus as being a pure priest. I want for you to count them.

Hebrews 7:26 For it was fitting for us to have such a high priest, holy, innocent, undeflied, separated from sinners and exalted above the

We have five words (and phrases) there: (1) Holy, (2) innocent, (3) undefiled, (4) separated from sinners and (5) exalted above the heavens Let's take these words and phrases one by one and think about them.

1. Jesus is Holy.

This means that Jesus is perfectly clean. He is totally without sin. This is why Jesus shone on the mount of transfiguration (Matt. 172.) His purply was shrining through. This word obviously brings us back to think of the angels around the thore of close davings. "Hey, how, how, he bat CBOR Code, the Amighty how sand who has with who is to com? (Rev. 43). What is said of cod is said of Jesus CIVIII. And, He's not holy because He is forgiven and cleansed. Rather, He is holy because that is what he is by nate.

2. Jesus is innocent.

You might easily translate this word, "Diameters," It cames the side of this pure life. There is nothing in Jeaus that you could ever identity is as in It in on that Jeaus was forgiven as we are. Nether is It hat Jeaus as declared innocent in a court of tww. No, Jeaus never sinned, and therefore was completely blameters. Plate, who investigated the charges against tim, asked His accuest." What will have ide done? (Matt 27:23)

3. Jesus in undefiled

One of the difficulties of living in the world is that those in the world can influence us toward evil. Priests were especially susceptible to this, as those around them could easily define them. By touching a dead tody, a priest was defied. When lease touched a dead body, it can be light, the shift world had to effect upon Lease. Here as instructioned by the world. One commentator compared Jesus to the physician. "Who works among the sick at the time of an epidemic, but who is immune" Cl.

4. Jesus is separated from sinners

To be sure, Jesus shared in our humanity. But, Jesus never participated in our sin. He was a friend of sinners (Matt. 11:19), But, He was never engaged in sin Himself. When it came to sin, Jesus kept His full distance from it. He is utterly relended.

5. Jesus is exalted above the heavens

This is mentioned several times in the book of Hebrews. Hebrews 1:3, "He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high." Hebrews 8:1, "Lieus has laten his seat at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens." Hebrews 1:22, "Lieusil has at down at the right hand of the throne of God." There is no higher position to be offered, than the position that Jesus owns in the universe. Hebrews 1 fells us that all the angels worship Him!

Such is the picture of our high priest, king Jesus. He is pure, innocent, holy, righteous, altogether different than we are. I would encourage you to put this picture of Jesus into your mind. I encourage you to be ready to share this with others, should the need arise.

The past Monday, some Jehovah's whresses came to our door. When I discerned who they were and what they wanted, I stepped outside to speak with them. The older gentleman came and asid to me. And, having meditated upon Jesus and His prayer last week, I said this. "You don't believe that Jesus is God, do you." He was silent. "Well, what about this very text which you are quoting with me. Have you considered verse 1? Father, the hour has come; giontly You. That we come, giontly You. Have you considered verse 5? Father, don't We begiven with Yousel with be glow which I had with before the world was." Didn't isaiah say. My glory, I will give to no other (is. 42.8)? This text right here shows that Jesus is God."

I do beleve that he was shocked at what I said. I called him to worship Jesus, the true God. At this point, the man responded much like dehowin's Witnesses often respond. He said, "Veil, I effs turn over to Cobasians and look at this verse." I said, "No, I eff shink about the verse and the glory of uses, it says in freedalion 5 that the host of the heavers will be worships (Jesus.). To him who shat on the throne, and to the Lamb, be blessing and honor and glory and dominion forever and ever? (Rev. 5:13) I said, "That's Jesus, having been lifted up the throne of the merget in the heavens, is being worships of an in heavers as guark thin God."

He said, "Well, in Colossians it says that He is the firstborn from the dead." In no way was this man prepared to interact with the Scripture. He and his companion left pretty quickly, without interest in what I was saying.

The implications of His purity come in verse 26, where we read, "It was fitting for us to have such a high priest." In other words, "Such a high priest fits our need exactly. Or, as the NIV says it, "Such a high priest meets our need." He is suitable to bring us to God.

Jesus is far different than any priest that has ever walked upon the planet. They all had to offer up sacrifices for themselves before they would ever able to offer up sacrifices for others. But, Jesus was different than this. He didn't have to offer up any sacrifices for Himself because, he was "holy, innocent, undefled, and separated from sinnes" (verse 26).

Just imagine with me the experience that an Old Testament saint would have in bringing his sacrifice to the priest. He sins in some way. So, he goes to the temple with his lamb in hard. He brings the animal to the priest and explains the situation. "I have sinned. Here is my lamb. Please offer up was sacrifice for me."



The priest says, "Sure, no problem." Soon, he departs and takes a lamb of his own and waks toward the altar. He slits the lamb's throat and offlers up he tamb upon the attar as a sacrifice. And you know white he's doing, right? He's offening up a sacrifice find to his own sins. There, he is be cleaned and upditieflo to die ny a sacrifice for your has hown in actuality. I doin't eash yaged he worker in the Child Testament that required a privat to offer up a sacrifice for new yaardhice that he would offer on behalf of others. Over in chapter 9, verse 7, we read of the day of atonement, when the high priest would offer up a sacrifice for the sins of the people. We read, "thich be second, only the high priest entres once a year, not without taking blood, which he defes for himself and for the sins of the people committed in gionance." Although this verse is apakening about what took place noce a year, according to verse 27, this happened a day basis. There is some discussion as to what this means, as the 'Oid Testament never demanded a daily ascrifice for the priests. It must refer to the sacrifice made every homing.

At any rate, here's the point the priese would offer up a sacrifice for Himself, and then he would be cleaned of his own sin to be able qualified to then around and offer up sacrifice for your an. But not so the sacrifice of Christ. His life was a pure life. There was no sin in Him. There was no need for Him to offer up a sacrifice for Himself. I hope that you see how great the sacrifice of Christ was. The priests in Israel all offered up animals, but Christ offered up Himself.

It's like the pig and the chicken, who were on their way to breakfast. Along the way, they were trying to decide what to have. The chicken said, "Lefs have ham and eggs." The pig then replied, "That's fine for you, it's a small conation on your part, but it's a total sacrifice for me." For Jesus, It was total sacrifice. He dinth sacrifice another animal. No, the sacrificed thmself.

Do you have any idea how great this sacifice was? See. It one things to offer up a tag as a sacifice. No big deat. Little boys with mappinging glasses derup ants all summer long in smole. PET A lan't around to complan about the killing of bogs. But, it's another thing to offer up an minimal, like a share or a bul. There are there with believe first such things are immortiand arwings. But, it's yet another thing for God to be sacrificed! But that's what took place on the cross. Jesus Christ-the holy, innocent, undefied one-was sacrificed upon the cross. And this is why it was Jesus only needed to be offeed upone. He is the final priest. Look again at verse 27, ...

Hebrews 7:27 who does not need daily, like those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the sins of the people, because this He did once for all when He offered up Himself.

The sacrifice of Jesus Christ was so great that it only needed to be offered once! There was no need to repeat the sacrifices. This will be a large theme in chapter 10. Look over at Hebrews 10:10, ...

Indexees 05 10 54 a The pit hand as been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Ohrist once for all Every priest stands or ministering and offering time after time the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins, but He, having offered or sacrifice for sins for all time, sat cours at the right hand of Code, valinitg from that time onward until His enemies be ma totabol for ris feet. For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

The sacrifice of Jesus Christ never needs to be repeated. This is the abomination that takes place in the Roman Catholic Church in the Mass. They claim that Jesus Christ is being offered up in every Mass, as the communion wafer is transubstantiated into His body and blood. Consider the official teaching of the Roman Catholic Church.

What is the Mass? The sacrifice of the Cross, the sacrifice of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, offered in an unbloody manner under the appearances of bread and wine.

Is the Mass a true sacifice? Yes, it contains all the elements of a true sacrifice, priest and victim-gift and offering. By the separate consecration of the bread and when which symbolizes His death, Jesus, the Victim of the Calvary Sacrifice, becomes truly present on the attar. ^[2]

But, the sacrifice of Jesus Christ was once for all. This makes Him a final priest (verse 27), If you have one sacrifice, which is sufficient to all time, there is no other need for another priest; there is no other need for another sacrifice. Christ's sacrifice was sufficient to atone for the sime that took jace before the cross. Hetewas 0.5 f Says, "For this reason het is the methatic of a new overnamic, to that, and a set that has taken place for the redengtion of the transgressions that were committed under the first covenant, those who have been called may receive the promes of the deting infertance." In other words, the sacrifice of Jesus Christ taket of the sins of David, how low 1.000 years before Christ did. The sacrifice of Jesus Christ paid for the sins of Anraham, who low 2.000 years before Christ did.

But, not only did the sacrifice of Jesus pay for the sins that took place before the cross. His sacrifice was sufficient to atone for the sins that took place after the cross. Think about it. When were your sins committed? Last week? Last yea? (10 years ago? 30 years ago? If your sins are vero to be forgiven, they must have been forgiven through a sacrifice that took place 2000 years ago.

There is nothing that you can do today to improve upon the work of Christ. There are no more sacrifices that are needed. You can't do anything to make up for your sins. Stady, we often live like we can do something to make up for or up sins. We think that reading the Blace more is agoing to ready our or and. We think that praying more to do cal space to finally tready our sins. We think that reading the Blace about the single to ready the them. We like to show to God how bady we field about our sits or how committed we are to serving the Land. And thus, in some measure, we think that our efforts will alwo God that we are working this regioners.

But, none of these things can improve upon the sacrifice of Christ. And in actuality, they lessen the cross, because we think that by doing these things we can aid somehow in our justification. But, we can't. The work of Jesus Christ upon the cross is sufficient to atone for our sins

David Dickson, a Scottish minister in the 1600's, said on his deathbed, "I have taken all my good deeds, and all my bad and cast them in a heap before the Lord, and fled from both, and betaken myself to the Lord Jesus Christ, and in him I have sweet peace."

And this is the great reality of what we will celebrate in the Lord's Supper. We celebrate the concelor of ascrifice of Lease Christ, never needing to be repeated again. And we remember that time, when Jesus deel for us. Jesus told us to remember His death through the bread and the cup.

3. A Perfect Priest (verse 28)

Hebrews 7:28 For the Law appoints men as high priests who are weak, but the word of the oath, which came after the Law, appoints a Son, made perfect forever.

There is a contrast in verse 28. It's the contrast between the priests appointed by the law of God, and the priest appointed by the cath. First of all, there is a contrast in who was appointed to the office of priest. The law appointed men as high priests. Regular guys, like you and me, became priests. But, the cath of God appointed the Son of God as a priest.

Second, there is a contrast in their abilities. The priests appointed by the law were weak men. But, the priest appointed by the oath is the perfect Son. Now, those priests of the Oid Covenant were weak, not in the same that they laised physical strength. but rather in the same that they were similar and allowed and in new of forgiveness. Exercise Christ, on the other strand, law have assen, was sintes and blamete and completely able to approach God on His on metrics. In this way, we can say that Jesus Christ is "throng." Or, we could say that He is "perfect." Vierse 2 Carls frim, Thoy, income, undefields, parameter from similars, carls advore the heaviers."

There is also a contrast in how they were appointed. The priests of the Old Testament were appointed by law. That is, they appealed to historical proclamation, historical precedent. They were appointed according to need. The Old Covenant needed priests to fulfill their function historical proclamation, Somebody had to do it

But, Jesus, was appointed high priest by oath by the oath of God! Hebrews 7:21 quotes from Psalm 110:4 (which came 1,000 years after the law): "the Lord has swom and will not change His mind, "You are a priest forever." And with such an oath comes honor.

There is a big difference between the policeman, and the head of the FBI. One comes to work in the force because of the need to fulfill a role in executing the law. The other comes to work as head over the agency, because of the selection of the president. Such is the difference between Jesus Christ and the priests of the Old Covernant. They were agointed to be priest from the law. Sues was appointed by the cash in exect betweet of God! In every way, the appointment of Jesus Christ as a high priest is better than any other priest. He is a perfect priest (verse 28)

This phrase at the end of verse 28 may throw you for a bit. It says that Jesus Christ was "made perfect forever." Don't think that this means that He was "imperfect" at one time, but now has come into perfection. Rather, think like Hadrews 210, which used the same terminology. As we wrap things up here this morning, I want for you to reflect upon our high priest. Jesus is a pure priest (verses 26), a final priest (verse 27), and a perfect priest (verse 28).
